Class Changes & Refunds

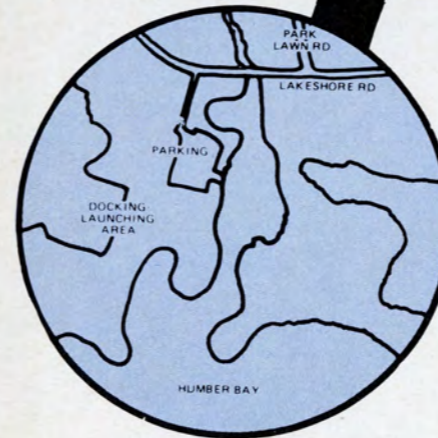
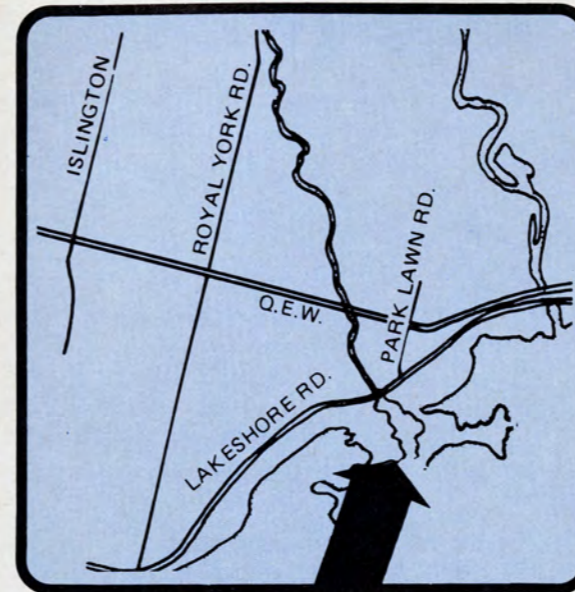
Because of the popularity of the Sailing Program, the following policies will apply:

- 1) You may request a change from one class to another up to one week prior to the commencement of the class if space is available.
- 2) You may withdraw from a class and request a refund in writing up to one week prior to the commencement of your class. You will receive a refund, less a \$10.00 administrative charge.

If you withdraw from your class less than one week prior, but before the second class is held, you will receive a refund, less a **\$40.00** charge. After the second class has been held, we will not refund your fees.

Note: The judgement of the instructor is the **SOLE** criterion for cancellation of the on-the-water classes due to weather or lake conditions. Classroom sessions will be substituted when weather prohibits sailing. The School will attempt to schedule make up classes when possible.

OUR PROGRAM

BASIC COURSE

Who: This course is for the absolute novice.

What: We introduce the basics of sailing, points of sail, tacking and jibing, man overboard, explain terminology, demonstrate the uses for knots you learn and teach you how to rig and care for a sailing dinghy properly. This course consists of eight—three hour classes in the boats plus 3 hours in the classroom. Upon successful completion of this course you may be eligible for the Canadian Yachting Association White Sail II award.

Cost: The Fee is \$95.00 and includes the 'CYA' Basic Learn to Sail manual and notes.

INTERMEDIATE COURSE

Who: This course is for those with some experience in dinghies, or who have completed a basic course.

What: This course reviews the material covered in our basic course and introduces exercises to improve precision and speed. The Trapeze is introduced, and emergency procedures including capsizes are practiced. Students who successfully complete this course are eligible for the CYA White Sail III award. This course consists of eight—three hour classes in the boats plus three hours in the classroom.

Cost: The fee is \$95.00 and includes the 'CYA' Basic Learn to Sail manual and notes.

ADVANCED COURSE

Who: This course is for those who have recently completed a basic or intermediate course or who are admitted to the program by our head instructor based on a personal interview.

What: This course reviews the material covered in the basic and intermediate programs and introduces you to racing techniques including flying a spinnaker. This course develops precision in heavier winds and upon successful completion, students may be eligible for the CYA Bronze Sail IV award.

The course consists of eight—three hour classes in the boats plus five hours in the classroom.

Cost: The fee is \$115 and includes CYA advanced Learn to Sail manual and notes.

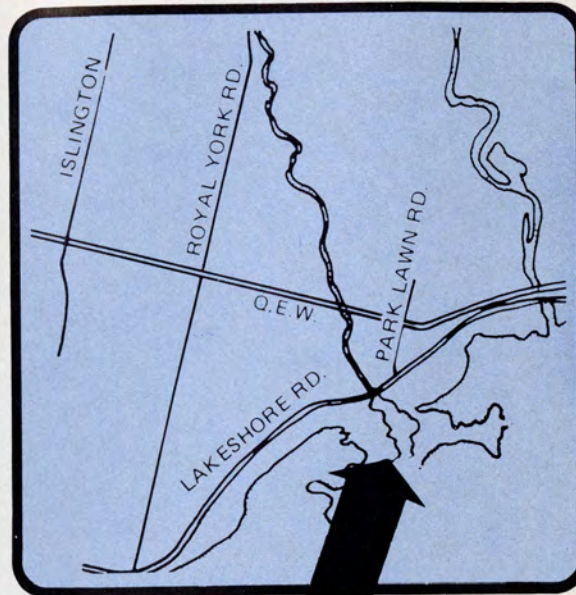

Whether your interest is in leisurely cruising with friends, or competitive racing, Humber's programs help you to develop ability and confidence.

This summer we offer a choice of boats. You may take our course on either a heavy displacement steel hull 36 ft. Ketch or on a light displacement fibreglass keel boat in the 22 to 25 ft size range.

- * handout notes and marine information
- * a school binder
- * 18 hours instruction on the boat
- * 9 hours of classroom lectures and exam.

OUR PROGRAM

Basic Course

Who: This course is for those with no sailing experience.

What: We introduce the basics of sailing . . . tacking, jibing, points of sail, man overboard and emergency procedures, manoeuvring under power and sail, anchoring and docking. We explain terminology, rigging, demonstrate uses for knots and ropework, present basic sailing theory and good seamanship practices.

The course consists of eighteen hours of instruction on the boat and nine hours in class, including the optional CYA basic exam. Upon successful completion of this course you may be eligible for the CYA Basic Coastal Cruising Standard.

Cost: The fee is \$150.00 and includes the CYA logbook, text, notes and school binder.

Intermediate Course

Who: This course is for those with a little keel boat experience or who have sailed dinghies and want to move up to keel boats.

What: This course reviews the material covered in our Basic course and introduces exercises to improve precision and speed. Docking under power and sail, manoeuvring in close quarters, operating in heavier wind and seas (reefing), weather and electronic navigation aids are the areas on which we concentrate at this level. This course consists of eighteen hours of instruction on the boat and nine hours in class, including the optional CYA Basic exam. Upon successful completion of this course may be eligible for the CYA Basic Coastal Cruising Standard.

Cost: The fee is \$150.00 and includes the CYA logbook, text, notes and school binder.

Advanced Course

Who: This course is for those who have completed a basic or intermediate keelboat course, or who are admitted by the head instructor, based on their sailing experience.

What: This course provides a brief review of the topics covered in the Basic and Intermediate levels, but is designed to be a workshop to develop proficiency in cruising and racing techniques. Practical exercises will be undertaken in racing techniques, including use of spinnaker, navigation — taking bearings, following a course, and celestial sights. Students' individual interests and concerns will be addressed. The class size for this level is restricted in order to maximize personal practice time. The course consists of eighteen hours on the boat.

Cost: The fee is \$150.00 and includes CYA logbook, text, notes and school binder.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Our courses consist of four sessions of 4 1/2 hours each. They are scheduled to run on Saturday and Sunday for two consecutive weekends or for four days during one week.

The schedule for classroom instruction will be posted at our Humber Bay site. Before the first class, you will receive a package of pre-course reading, directions to our docks and our dockside phone number.

AREAS FOR TRAINING

Includes how to plan, organize, develop and operate one or more of marina, yacht club, manufacturing, wholesale or retail sales, yacht repair, yacht brokerage, marine insurance and yacht charter activities. Training takes account of the needs of full-time and part-time trainees - many of whom have extensive business, professional, tradesmen, craftsman or seamanship experience to bring to the training. The training is practical, with the emphasis placed upon the ability to perform the tasks of management and/or operation. The training gives due credit for practical, theoretical or journeyman experience in activities related to the service industry concerned. The training is at the post-secondary level.

DURATION

The basic structure of the program is two (2) years of general studies followed by a third (3rd) year of advanced studies in one specialty area.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Ontario Secondary School graduation diploma or if you are 19 years of age or over and have had one year of work experience, you may be eligible to apply as a mature student.

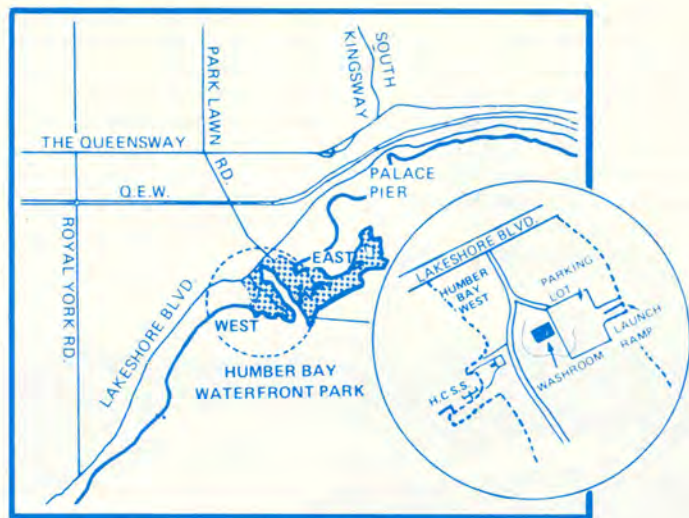

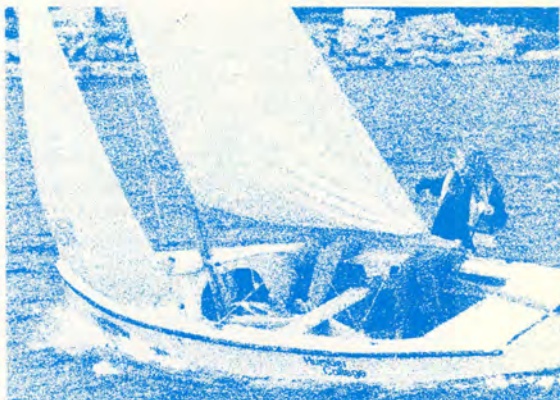
Dinghy Instruction

Learning how to sail in a dinghy can be one of the most exciting introductions to a new sport. The responsiveness and simplicity associated with sailing a small craft makes it an excellent way to break into sailing in an inexpensive way.

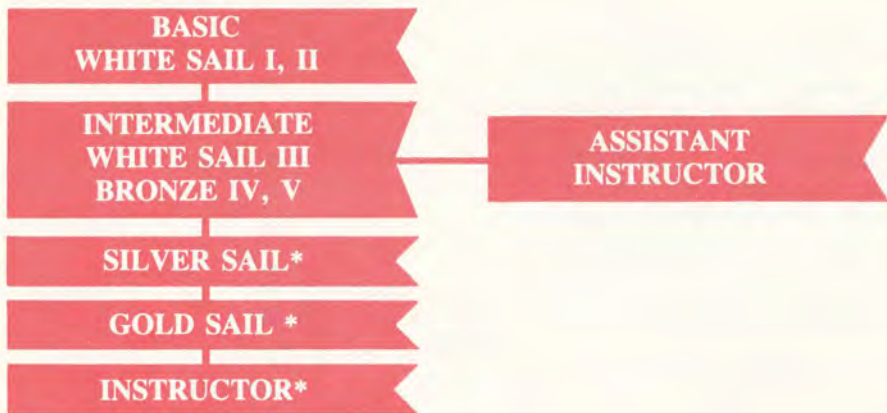
We offer dinghy instruction at two different levels. **Basic Dinghy** is taught aboard stable Wayfarer dinghies and is suited to people who wish an introduction to the sport. The course is taught to C.Y.A. White Sail I and II standards.

Our **Intermediate** course is taught aboard a much faster and sleeker craft. Laser II's are used and instruction follows the C.Y.A. White Sail III, and Bronze IV.

Once these standards have been attained, candidates may, with permission from the Head Instructor, advance to a higher level.

Junior Sailing School

In this program children are evaluated during the first lesson and then grouped with others of the same ability. This ensures that a child will not be intimidated by the skills of other children. On the other hand, a child exhibiting strong sailing skills will be challenged and coached to higher levels. Children work in small groups and develop their skills through demonstration, practice, games and short talks. Most of the time is spent on the water, stressing safety, good seamanship and a positive attitude. Participation, activity and fun are the key ingredients in our Junior School.

Fall and Winter Marine Courses

Basic Coastal Cruising

The first half of this eight-week course will cover the seamanship and theory components of the CYA Basic Coastal Cruising Standard, including the exam. In the second half, students will examine the practical considerations of cruising in Georgian Bay, Lake Ontario, the Erie Barge Canal and the Island Coastal Waterway (New Jersey to Florida). This course is intended for new sailors or sailors new to cruising.

Celestial Navigation

This course is designed to introduce the principle and methods of celestial navigation for the novice; enable students to understand and be able to utilize celestial sightings to determine positions; develop proficiency in interesting celestial sightings by using sight reduction tables; develop skill in plotting position fixes and courses based on celestial sightings. Practical Coastal Navigation

This basic navigation course introduces students to the knowledge, skills and instruments to navigate successfully in coastal waters. Through lectures and exercises, students will gain skill and confidence in: marine charts; compass and its errors; rules of navigation and seamanship; aids to navigation and instruments. Exercises include: plotting course lines; fixing positions; reading charts and tide calculations. This course will require the purchase of several charts, parallel rule, protractor and dividers.

Sailboat Diesel Maintenance

This course will acquaint sailors with the principles of the internal combustion diesel engine. You will become familiar with engine operation, routine maintenance such as fuel filters and oil changes, as well as minor repairs which can be handled easily with a minimal tool kit.

Southern Cruise 'n Learn Program

Once again this winter, we will be offering Learn to Sail courses in the British Virgin Islands, a very popular course with everyone, including the instructor.

The C.Y.A. Basic, Intermediate, and Advanced Standards will be taught aboard our C&C yachts, with each boat having its own instructor. Students find that spending a full week on board is the best way to learn because of the continual subjection of the pupil to real life sailing concerns. Leaving a strange dock and heading out on salt water to an island anchorage that is only visible on the chart provides students with all-day adventure and is a true test of skills.

Our instructors are all familiar with the islands and can offer much local knowledge as well as sailing tutorage.

The number of students per boat is limited to six (6) so that privacy as well as individualized attention is guaranteed.

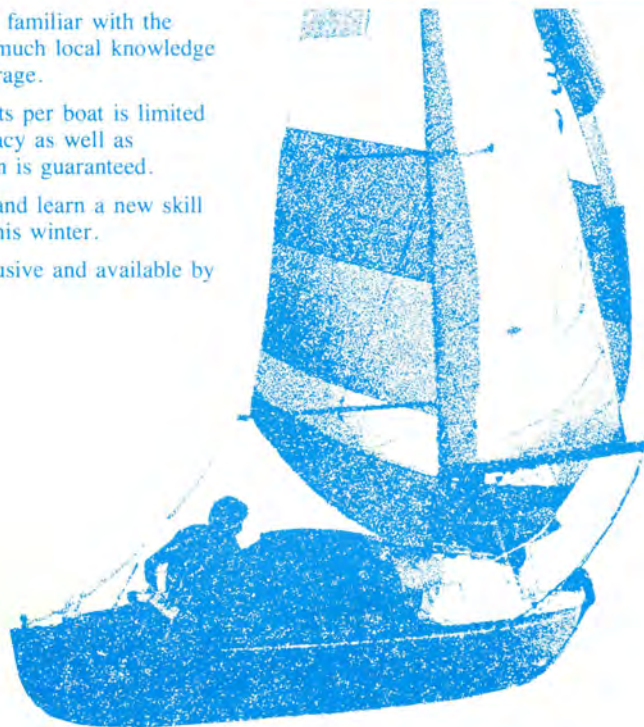
