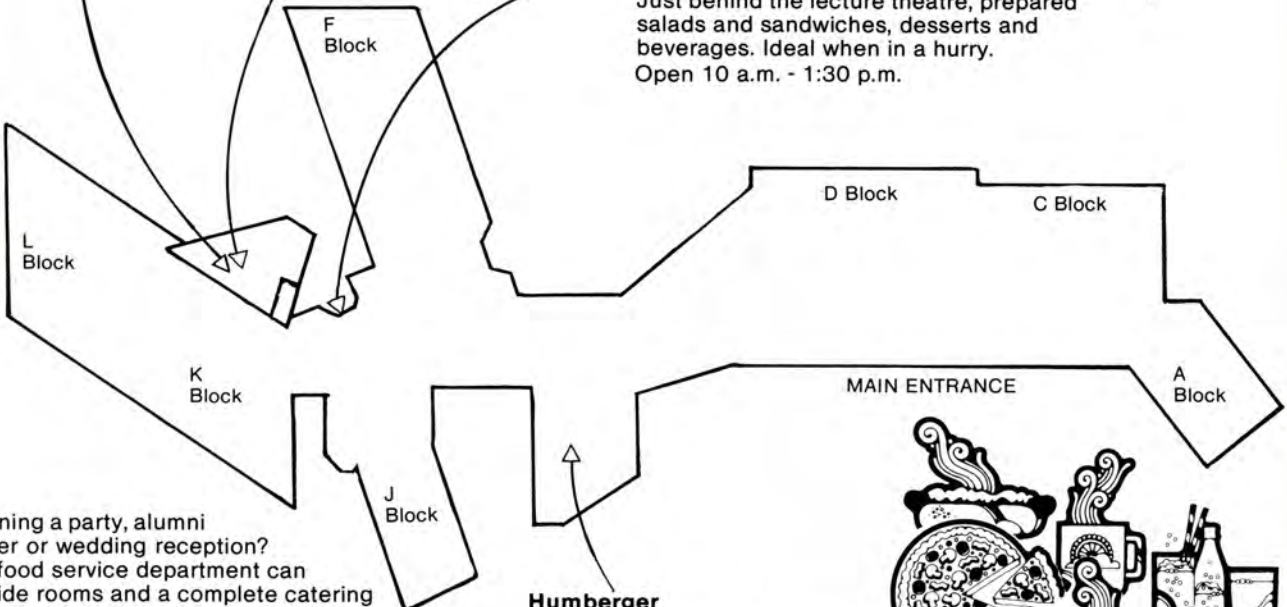

Welcome to Humber College! Best wishes for 1983/84. Have a good one!

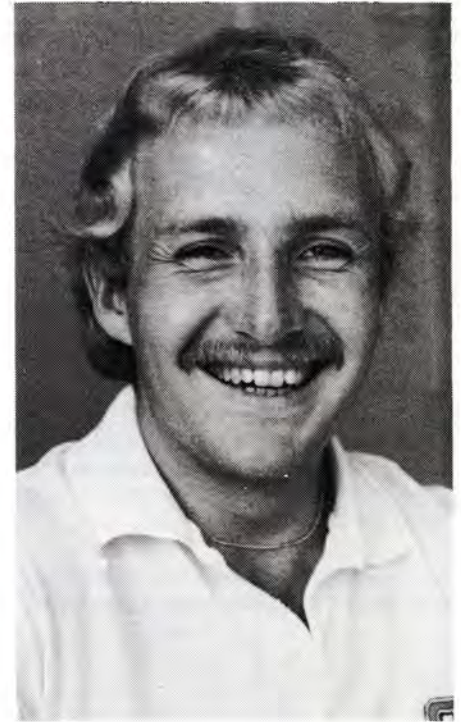


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a few words from...

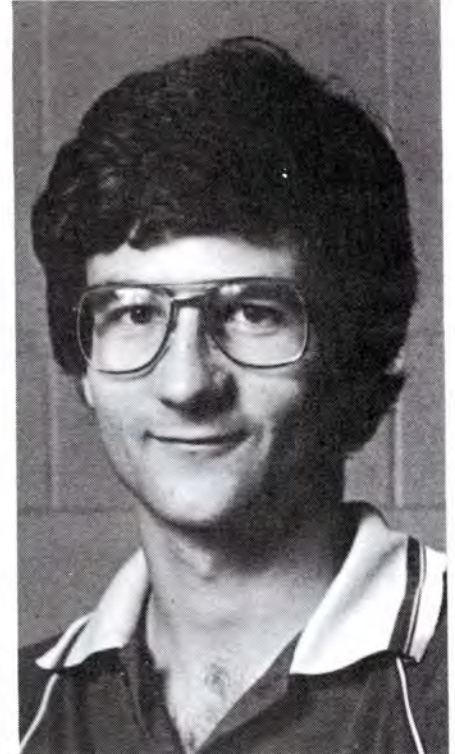
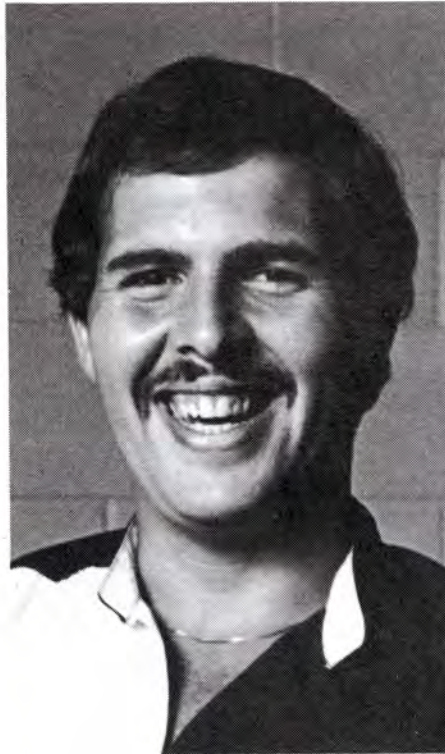

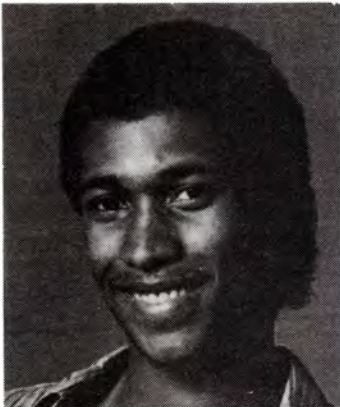

## Margaret Hobbs

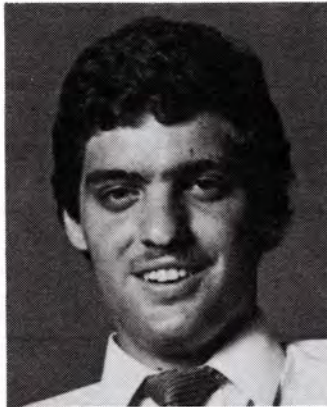

# Services



SAC would like to promote an environment where all students develop their interests and get involved with Humber College. Clubs and Course Associations give students a chance to socialize with friends that have the same interests.

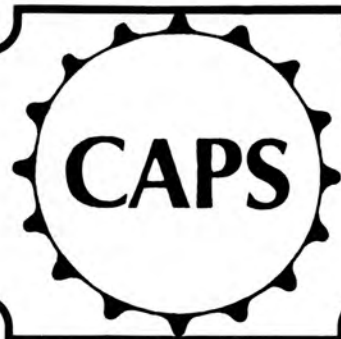


## WINTER MADNESS

7. Fighting in or around the Gordon Wragg Student Centre will result in immediate ban of one year.

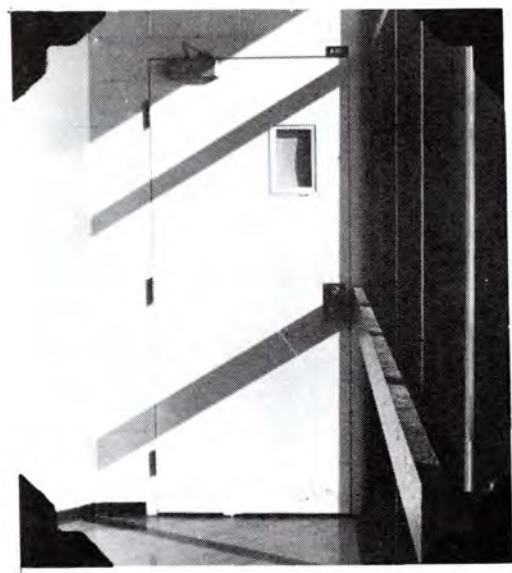

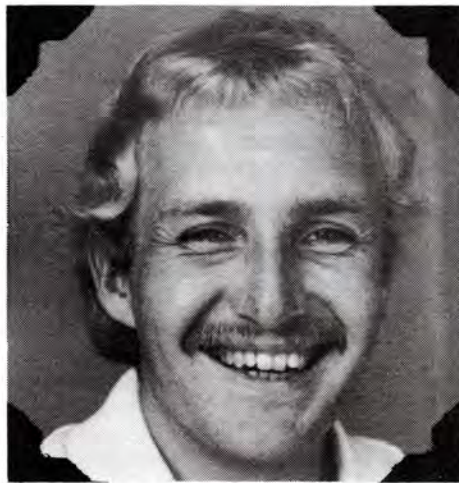

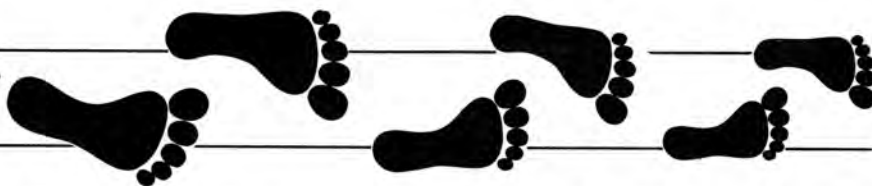

## HEALTH CENTRE

There is an on-campus Health Centre for Humber College students. The centre is located in Room K-137, near the Pipe. It is open daily from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Emergency treatment of illness and injury, referrals to other doctors for more complex problems, and health counselling are available free of charge. The centre is staffed by registered nurses during office hours. A doctor is available to students, on a limited basis, (Thursday).

Students are responsible for their own health insurance. (OHIP) An Ontario resident ceases to be classified as a dependent of parents in the Ontario Health Insurance Plan after the age of 21. To maintain coverage, application should be made to the Plan within 30 days.

Non-resident students should ensure coverage, either through OHIP or a private plan.

Application forms, for enrolment and premium assistance, are available in the Health Centre.

## HUMBUSERVICE INFORMATION

Effective September 1st, Humber runs a bus service to certain places for 85¢ a ride. All information and schedules can be obtained from Don McLean, Superintendent of Outside Services. Tickets are available in the Hawk Shop, 85¢ for each one way ticket.

## TTC

There are two TTC bus lines to Humber College:

Wilson 96  
Finch 36B

Single tickets are 85 cents each or 6 tickets for \$4.00. The cost of the ride also

includes transfers to another bus, street-cars, and subway lines. Routes and schedules are available by calling TTC information at 484-4544. The number for wheelchair transportation and registration is 524-9511.

## PARKING

Humber College has the right to regulate vehicles using the roads and parking lots on college property.

### Parking Area

**Daily Rate** \$1.00 per day  
(7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.)

**Meter Parking** \$ .50 per hour  
(limited to 2 hours)

**Motorcycles** \$ .50 per day  
(space designated in daily parking lot)

You may receive a ticket of \$10.00 for parking illegally, (ie. parking in the wrong lot).

The College Security also has the authority to tow away any vehicle that is illegally parked at the owner's expense.

Students are encouraged to obtain a complete set of the official College Parking Regulations available at any College Bookstore.

## CHILD CARE

### The Children's Activity Centre

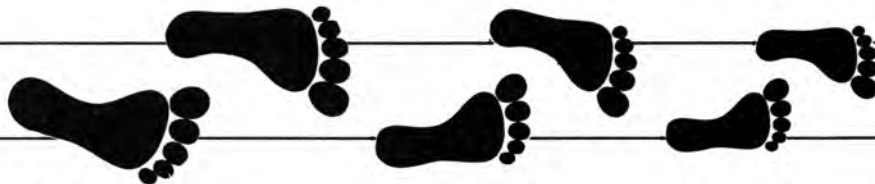
The Children's Activity Centre is a part-time service for children whose parents are on the North Campus. It is located in Room D-119. This centre caters to the varying needs of children from 16 months to five years; and up to seven years on Professional Development Days. The Centre is open from 7:45 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, and fees are calculated on an hourly basis. A maximum care of 24 hours per week for each child can be arranged to meet the needs of students and staff on campus on a part-time basis.

The program includes both indoor and outdoor activities, free play, creative activities, learning concepts and motor tasks are age-graded in order to maximize the child's learning experience. It is staffed by highly qualified staff.

The Centre is open from September to the end of April. For more information, please call.

### Day Care Centre

The Day Care Centre, located at H-155, offers a full-time program, five days of the week, year round. The hours of operation are from 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Fees are \$270.00 per month, but subsidy



is available for parents who require assistance.

The Centre is directed by Valerie Cochrane and staffed by highly qualified teachers. A trained dietician is also on staff to provide nutritionally balanced snacks and a full-course noon meal.

The Centre provides a well planned and safe environment for the physical, social, emotional and cognitive growth of pre-school children. Up to 50 children between the ages of two to five years can be accommodated in the Centre.

Applications should be made early as there is usually a waiting list. For more information, please call.

## HOUSING OFFICE

Since Humber College has a great number of out of town students, the Housing Office was set up to help students find living accommodations for the school year.

The Housing Office is designed to give the student information about the various types of accommodation available in the Rexdale/Etobicoke area.

Our service provides listings for rooms, room and board, houses, apartments and flats, as well as general information about college activities. In addition, there are telephones for contacting landlords, TTC Guides, tenant information and a HOUSING AND INFORMATION pamphlet to help the students with their search.

The Housing Office, which is located in the SAC Conference Room, is open from May to September each year. During the remainder of the year, inquiries may be directed to the Registrar's Office.

The Housing Office is provided as a student service by Humber College through the Registrar's Office. We would like to thank the Student Association Council for the use of their Conference Room as our office during the summer months.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The primary responsibility for funding your education is yours. There are, however, some forms of assistance you should know about.

### Temporary Loan Assistance - Short Term

Humber College has organized a temporary loan assistance program, (short term), through funds obtained from corporations, community organizations, and other interested persons.

Because the funds are limited in nature, the assistance granted covers emergencies. The loan is repayable according to the terms arranged with the Financial

Aids Officer.

### Scholarships and Bursaries

Through the generosity of associations, businesses, industries, interested individuals, professional societies, service clubs, SAC and others, a number of Scholarships and Bursaries are available to students at Humber College.

### O.S.A.P.

The Ontario Student Assistance Program is intended to assist students who are Canadian citizens, or landed immigrants and residents of Ontario.

O.S.A.P. consists of four student aid plans:

- The Ontario Study Grant Plan
- The Canada Student Loans Plan
- The Ontario Student Loans Plan
- The Ontario Special Bursary Plan

The objective of O.S.A.P. is to assist students from lower or lower-middle income backgrounds to meet the costs of post-secondary education. The program is intended to supplement, not replace, the resources of students and/or their families. The assistance takes into consideration only basic education costs. No student, or parent, can arbitrarily choose to become independent for the purposes of the program. To be eligible to apply, the student must be enrolled as a full-time student in a post-secondary school certificate or diploma program. The type of assistance would depend on the number of weeks you are enrolled.

If you are having any problems with OSAP, either contact us or come to the SAC office and we'll help you break through.

Remember, if you're not satisfied with your grant or loan, you can always appeal.

## LIBRARIES

### Place to Study

If you have research to do for a project or need books to study for an upcoming exam, the place to go is the Humber College Learning Resource Centre (LRC). There are thousands of books and recent periodicals, all cross-referenced and easily located. The staff will help you locate whatever you require, and will show you how to use the LRC to your best advantage. For most material, all you need to show is your students card. However, some resources require advance booking and teacher's signature. Check at the main desk to be sure.

### Where?

The LRC is located in the E block, 2nd and 3rd Floors, which can be reached by taking the main stairway up from the Concourse.

The second floor section holds the hardcover and paperback books which circulate for two-week periods.

The third floor, while designed as a resource centre, is more than a place to study or conduct research. It is a garden of earthly delights for the curious, inquisitive or even slightly bored student. There are cassettes, LP's, videotapes, magazines and newspapers.

Photocopy machines are located on both second and third floors.

Fines on overdue materials may vary, but most books are charged 10 cents per day.

Arriving in a strange country can be an exciting experience for many. However, for some it is puzzling and frightening. There are new customs to respect and at times a whole new way of life to adjust to.

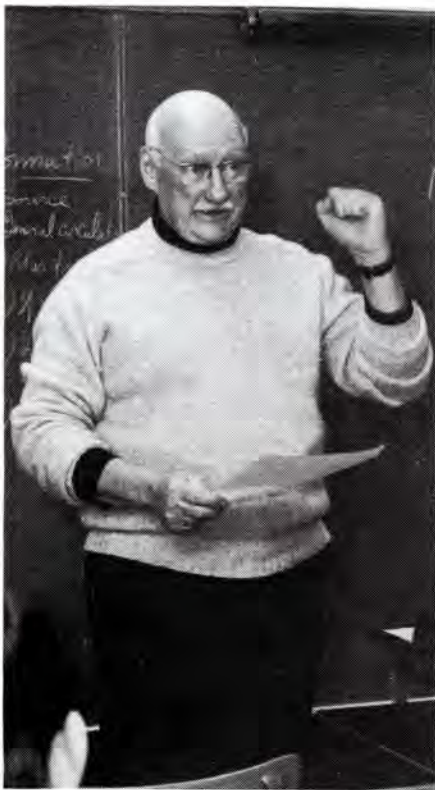

During your stay at Humber, you may wish to participate in a variety of activities related to women's issues. These activities include seminars, films and discussions on many related topics. If you wish to discuss women's issues, have personal concerns, need something organized relating to women, or, if you feel your rights (human rights, sexual harassment) are not being respected, then give Doris Tallon a call, or contact Penny in the SAC office.



## ACADEMIC REGULATIONS: (In a Nutshell)

1. It is the students responsibility to be familiar with the Academic Regulations. If a student is in doubt about any aspect of the Regulations, they should consult the office of their Divisional Dean.

2. Students will receive an outline for each course at the beginning of the semester. This will include the faculty members expectations regarding student performance and attendance, as well as the evaluation method to be employed.

3. Some Grade 13 and post-secondary courses a student has completed may result in advanced standing. Life experience may also be applicable. Check with the Registrar's office or your Divisional Dean.

4. Aegrotat standing may be granted if you are under a doctor's care and miss some of your required work. See your Dean and have substantial proof.

5. It is possible to audit a course but arrangements must be made in advance at the Registrar's office.

6. There are two kinds of withdrawals, voluntary and compulsory. If you decide to withdraw, let your Dean know. Compulsory withdrawals are the result of academic failure or just cause.

7. All credits are not automatically transferable between programs because of the difference in program requirements. See the Divisional Dean, if you have any questions.

8. The student is responsible for knowing the prerequisites of the courses they are taking. A student must successfully complete a first level course before going on to a second level course.

9. If you are not achieving satisfactory grades in your program, you may be placed on probation. This is a warning that you must improve your Academic standing.

10. Plagiarism may result in compulsory withdrawal.

### Academic Appeals Procedure

If you feel you are being treated unfairly, follow this procedure:

1. Speak to the faculty member.
2. Discuss it with the Senior Program Co-Ordinator and Chairman.
3. Discuss it with the Dean.
4. If you're still not satisfied, initiate a formal appeal through the Registrar's office.

If at any time during this procedure you are not satisfied, please feel free to come down to the SAC office and talk to one of the executive, we will do all we can to help you.

## TO GRADUATE:

To Graduate, the following conditions must be satisfied:

a) Students must have taken at least twenty-five (25) percent of their credits at Humber College.

b) Students must have successfully completed all requirements of the program in which they are enrolled, and must have achieved a weighted average of 60%. The weighted average is calculated for the last year of the program or the equivalent. To calculate the weighted average, multiply the percentage grade for each course by the number of credits for the course. The sum of the products divided by the total number of credits yields the weighted average.

c) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 9 (d), the following will apply:

i) Students enrolled in three year (6 semester) programs must not have grades of 50 to 59 percent in courses totalling more than 24 credits.

ii) Students enrolled in two year (4 semester) programs must not have grades

of 50 to 59 percent in courses totalling more than 16 credits.

iii) Students enrolled in one year (2 semester) programs must not have grades of 50 to 59 percent in courses totalling more than 8 credits.

d) Students enrolled in certificate programs of shorter duration should consult the Divisional Office for the graduation criteria.

e) Students who achieve an 80% or better weighted average calculated as in 14(b) above, graduate with honours. (The above provisions differ for selected areas of study. These will be clearly specified in Divisional and/or program regulations or policies.)

## YOU PAY FOR IT (IN PART), HAVE A SAY IN WHAT YOU GET — FACULTY EVALUATION

Each semester you will be asked in each class you take to fill out a questionnaire on the teaching-learning experience you've just had in that class. The information you give through "filling in the little boxes" will be compiled to give an overall picture based on three semesters of each teacher's work. The teacher in discussion with his/her supervisors will then work out a plan for increased personal and professional competency. You can influence the teaching you and other students receive. So what does this mean for you? Well, primarily it means that when the time comes, give it a shot, read the questions, think about how it does or does not relate to what you have experienced and generally, give it a chance. An honest, considered response is all that's asked for and anything less is a waste of your time.

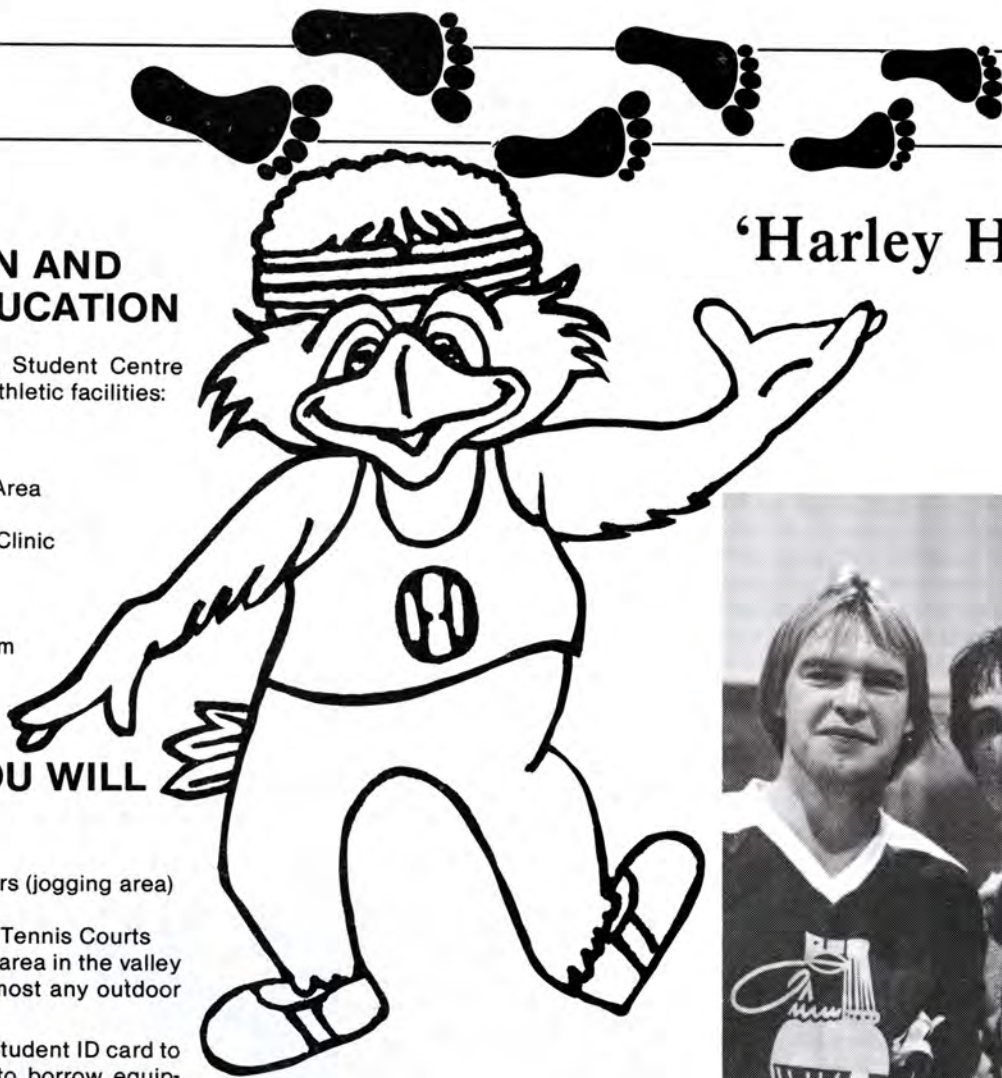

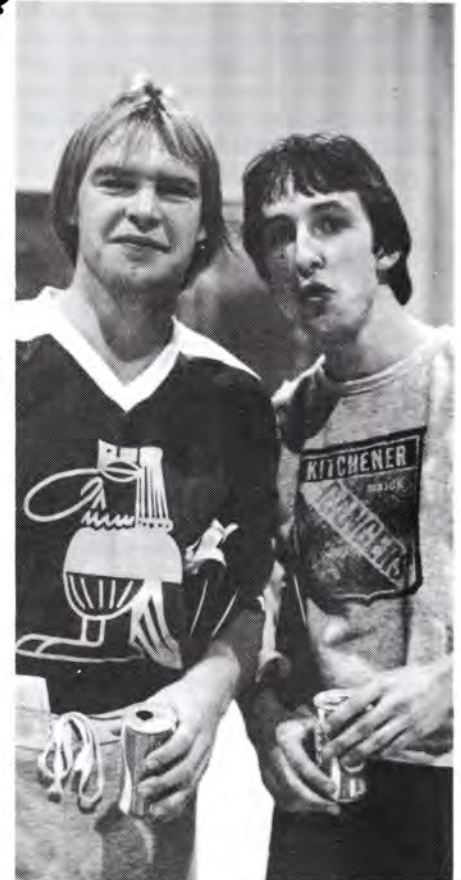

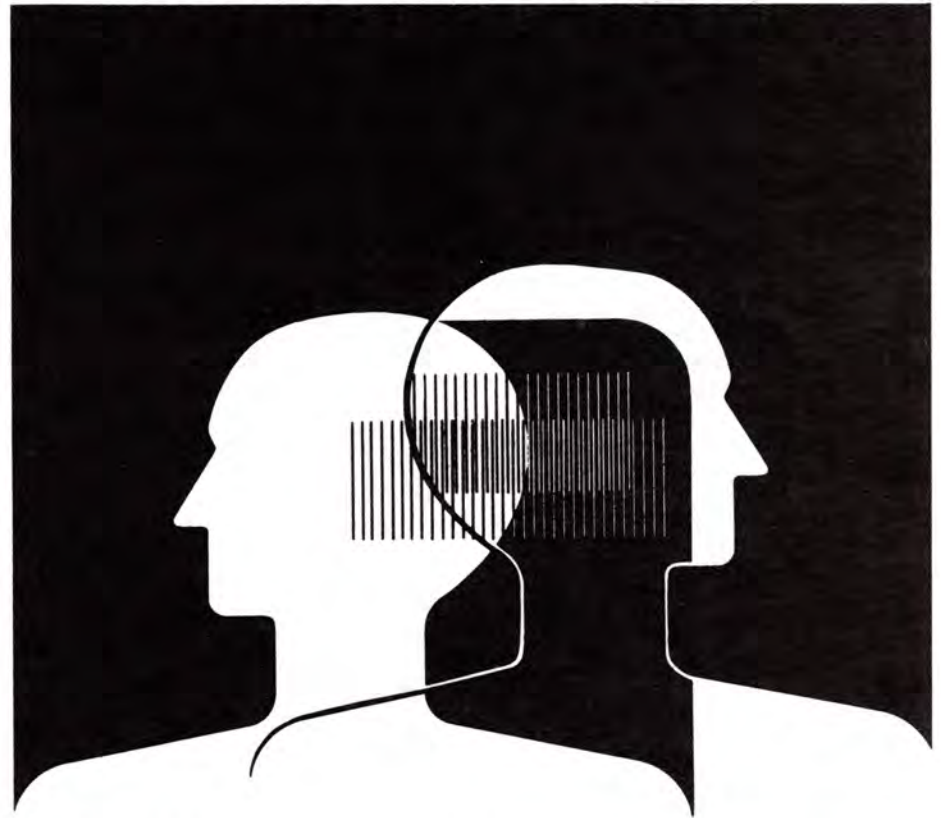

I thought that this letter would give me the opportunity to introduce the nursing program and everything going on around here, in one fell swoop.

Activities at Osler will be directed by your own executive and student body. First year students are welcome to attend our activities, although your classes will be held at North Campus. All second year students will attend Osler campus.

The council was chosen by the student body. We're sure that any of these people would be glad to answer any of your questions regarding student activities.

We believe it is safe to say that the first year nursing program will begin in the 18 classroom, move to the hospital a few

days a week, combined with a few days of theory, and end with a four month consolidation in the last semester.

The staff and administration of the nursing program are aware that the usual problems associated with the heavy clinical and academic program may create some confusion. Therefore, in order to identify these problems accurately and to solve them expediently, certain pathways of communication have been established and their use is encouraged.

The most formal pathy is called:

1. The Mentor System: where individual instructors are available to designated students for academic counselling. This is on an assigned basis.
2. Your individual instructor may be the closest to your situation and in many cases should be the one to whom you should approach first. This method of communication is strongly encouraged.
3. The bulletin boards at both campuses are used frequently by both students and staff. They will provide you with much of the information you may need regarding grades, activities, library notices, program information and changes etc.

The new student council will meet every two weeks to collect, consolidate and organize our concerns so that they

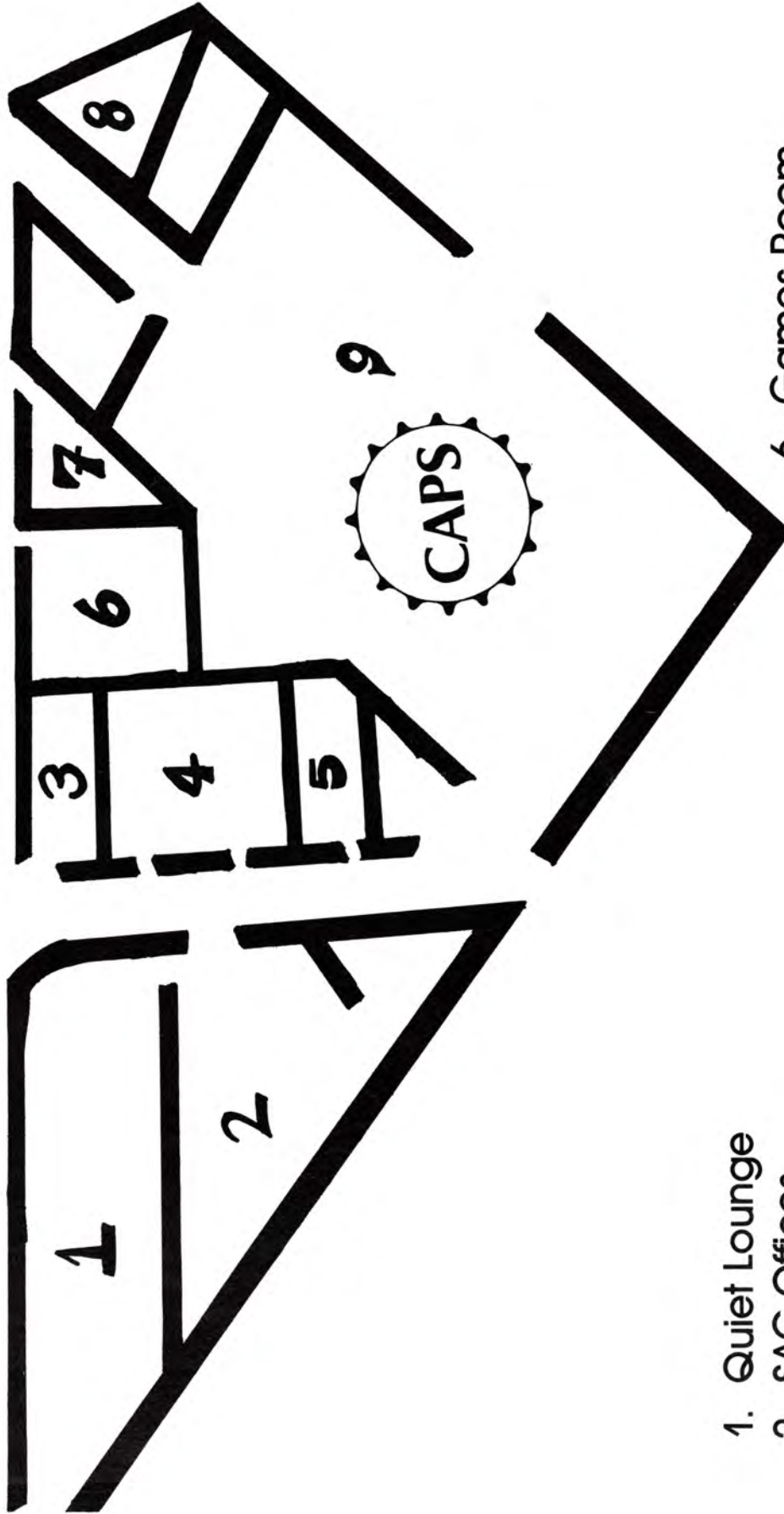

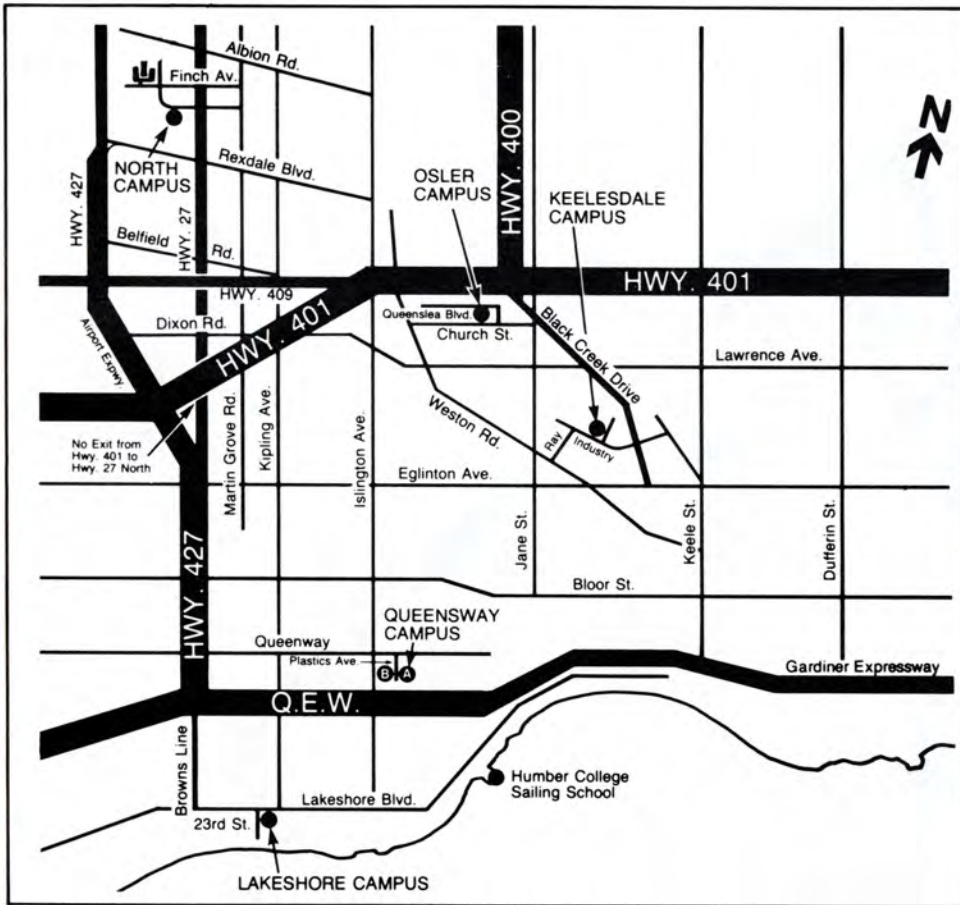
