## PBOGRAN

The General Arts and Science Program has grown and developed largely as a result of students who have studied with us and provided information about what they believe they need to become educated, informed citizens. We attempt to provide an educational setting where the student can explore his/her relationships with many aspects of our complex society such as our political system, our institutions, our value systems, our money problems and the student's own relationship with himself.

The student who enrols in the G.A.S. program wants to learn for a variety of reasons. For example, the student may want to continue with postsecondary education without a committment to a definite career orientation; or he may not have been accepted into a career program, but still wants to continue to earn valuable credits. Also, some students have chosen these academic courses to prepare them for further education in a university environment. Many universities in Canada and the U.S. recognize the G.A.S. program as providing credits sufficient to allow entry into their institution. Further information can be obtained from the program co-ordinators.

The program is designed with the generalist philosophy of education in mind. This approach allows the student to perk up his appetite for learning about himself, his relationships with others and his obligations to society as a responsible, contributing citizen. Also, the program allows time to determine, sensibly, primary career interests before embarking on a long term investment in the educational experience leading directly into a career.

Two program options are available to the student - a one year certificate or a two year diploma course of studies which may be completed either during regular day classes or, in the evening, through the Centre for Continuous Learning. Part-time students are required to have their programs approved by the G.A.S. Co-ordinator.

## THE ONE YEAR CERTIFICATE PROGRAM Two Semesters Day or Evening

The student is required to successfully complete a minimum of 40 credits including Communications I and either Communications II or English Literature II. In the first semester, the student will be assigned to a common curriculum designed and taught by Human Studies faculty. The student may also be timetabled into one or two courses, depending on availability, offered by the vocational divisions of Humber College. In the second semester the student may select from a number of second level courses.

## THE TWO YEAR DIPLOMA PROGRAM Four Semesters

The student is required to successfully complete a minimum of 75 credits including Communications I and either English Literature II or Communications II.
The diploma program allows the student to study, in greater scope and depth, any of the discipline courses offered by the Human Studies Division, or a mixture of courses from Human Studies and, where available, from the career program subjects.


The General Arts and Science program is offered at both the North and Lakeshore 1 campuses. The number and type of courses available at each campus may vary from time to time, based largely upon the number of students enrolled. The emphasis in this program is on a personalized course of study; therefore, any student considering General Arts and Science is strongly urged to arrange an early interview with the Program Co-ordinator at the campus he/she wishes to attend.

## THE COURSES: <br> Building Skills and Developing Strengths

The basic General Arts Program consists of six courses per semester, in the following areas:

- Reading, Writing and Mathematics When you enter the program, your skills in reading, writing and math will be assessed, and you'll be assigned to courses designed to strengthen your abilities in these areas.

Two of these courses, Communication I and Communications II, are required courses in all programs at Humber College. If you go on to a career program at Humber, the credits you earn in these courses can be transferred to your new program.

- Applied Psychology and Career Planning Here you'll discover how to focus your career interests and options, develop good job search techniques, improve your ability to manage time, and strengthen your study skills. These will help improve your chances of success not only in present and future courses, but in your career as well.


## - Academic Courses

These courses are meant to help you broaden your understanding of society and culture. Among those offered are "An Introduction to the Social Sciences," "Culture and Critical Thinking,"' and "Canadian Studies." These and other courses will provide a base for your future academic work while, at the same time, helping you strengthen your critical and analytical skills.

Credits earned in Academic Courses in the General Arts Program may be transferred to later career programs at Humber College, and may meet some of the admission requirements of Ontario universities.


## ANOTHER OPTION: Career Related Profiles

The General Arts Program offers several Career Related Profiles that combine basic General Arts courses with career-related courses designed to improve your chances of getting into a specific career program at Humber College. Two examples:

- The Pre-Health Profile prepares students for future studies in Nursing, Ambulance and Emergency Care, Pharmacy, or Funeral Services.
- The Pre-Music Profile helps students prepare for future studies in Music.

The specific profiles offered may vary from semester to semester, according to student demand and space availability.

It's also possible for General Arts students at Humber to take one or two courses offered in career programs, even if they're not part of a Career Related Profile. This is done by special arrangement with the General Arts Coordinator and the Coordinator of the career program.

## ADMISSION: What You Need

To get into the General Arts Program at Humber College, you need an Ontario Secondary School Diploma, or the equivalent.

Students who have been out of school for several years, or those who do not possess a Secondary School Graduation Diploma but are over 19 years old, may apply as Mature Students. Mature Student applications will be considered on an individual basis.

Admission requirements for the Career Related Profiles vary by program area. Details can be provided on request.

## GRADUATION: What You Get

On graduation from the General Arts Program at Humber College, a student is awarded:

- A Certificate for successful completion of two full semesters. This must include 12 courses and a minimum of 38 credits, including credits in Communications and Reading courses.
- A Diploma for successful completion of four semesters - 24 courses and a minimum of 76 credits, again including credits in Communications and Reading courses.

## Admission Requirements

To get into the General Arts Program at Humber, you need an Ontario Secondary School Diploma, or the equivalent.

If you have been out of school for several years, or if you do not possess a Secondary School Diploma but are over 19 years old, you may apply as a Mature Student. Mature Student applications are considered on an individual basis.

Admission requirements for the Career Related Profiles vary by program area. Call for details.

TProgram at Humber College consists of courses in three areas:

- Basic Skills Courses strengthen your abilities in reading, writing and math.
- Applied Psychology Courses help you improve your study skills and assist you in career planning.
- Academic Courses increase your knowledge in areas ranging from the Social Sciences to Literature.

General Arts also offers special Career Related Profiles tailored to students who hope to enter specific career programs at Humber College. For example, the PreHealth Profile prepares students for further studies in Nursing. Call for information about other Profile courses.

## When You Graduate

On graduation from the General Arts Program at Humber College, a student is awarded:
