## Humber College Opens Door To Future

PORT CREDIT — A new college of applied arts and technology was officially opened last Thursday, just outside the boundaries of Mississauga.

Humber College, located temporarily in the old James S. Bell Public School, Long

Branch, opened last September to a first year enrolment of 603 and expects an enrolment next year of 2,000, many of whom will come from Port Credit and Mississauga.

At the opening ceremony, Leslie Rowntree, Ontario Min-

ister of Financial and Commercial Affairs, said "Today's youth is a vast untapped resource whose potential is unlimited in this changing time."

### GREAT EXPERIENCE

Rowntree described the colleges of applied arts and technology scheme as "a great experience for the province."

He said it is now necessary to extend the educational system to meet the demands of a new world. "The need today can't be met by adding to or altering our secondary school system," said Rowntree. "It can only be met by institutions like Humber College.

Rowntree said the 39,000 students already enrolled in colleges of applied arts and technology show the need for this type of program.

### FIRST PRESIDENT

Gordon Wragg was installed as college president by E. S. Jarvis and S. L. Britton;

members of the board of governors and Dr. Murray Ross, president of York University.

Wragg said there are two basic reasons for the establishment of colleges of applied arts and technology.

"Appropriate post-secondary education is a necessity for all secondary school graduates, not just those planning to go on to university." "If you want economic advancement, the place to make your investment is in education," he said.

### MINORITY GROUP

Wragg stated that only four of every 100 students starting grade nine will complete his first degree in university. "Yet, it is this minority group of four out of every 100 which has in the past been glamorized and publicized. Education must not be the monopoly of an academic minority."

It is for the other 96 students, according to Wragg, that colleges like Humber have been instituted.
