

General Information

If you have been out of school for a year or more, the College Preparatory program can prepare you for admission to short skill or post-secondary programs at any Ontario College of Applied Arts and Technology. This program is, however, *not* designed for credit towards a high school diploma.

Career Information

Why should you take a College Preparatory Program?

This program provides the opportunity to:

1. further education within a post-secondary institution;
2. strengthen specific areas of weakness which might prevent the successful completion of educational goals;
3. advance within existing career goals or undertake remedial education prior to, or as part of, a change in career;
4. assess your abilities to further your formal education.

Admission Requirements

You must be a least 19 years of age; however, if you are a secondary school student, or have been absent from school less than one year, you must have a letter from your Guidance Department indicating that this alternative would be more valuable than continued study in a secondary school environment.

Fees

College Preparatory (full-time)

\$200 per semester (16 weeks)

College Preparatory (part-time day or evening) \$53 per 4.2 hours of instruction (If less than 4.2 hours is required, fees will be adjustable accordingly).

Certificate Awarded

Humber College awards a certificate upon completion of the program.

College Preparatory Program

(formerly ACADEMIC UPGRADING)

(Individualized Learning)

Level I, II, III and IV

This program utilizes prepared learning packages (similar to correspondence programs) and provides a maximum of personal interaction between you and your instructor. This approach permits flexibility in arranging your individual timetable and study guide to meet your personal needs.

Level I and II

In Levels I and II emphasis is placed upon providing a thorough grounding in basic English Communications. Level I Communications is designed for students with very low literacy skills and focuses upon basic reading, spelling, grammar, writing, listening and speaking.

When you complete Level II Communications, you will be able to read, comprehend vocational and general material and compose simple paragraphs. You will be able to speak clearly, coherently and effectively, and through listening, recall main ideas and relevant details as well as carry out a series of instructions.

In Level II you will study the Mathematics which will enable you to solve basic problems in whole numbers, fractions, decimals, percent and metric measurement.

Level III

In this level, the scope of the program is broadened to include Science and an option (Life Skills, Typing or Drafting) as well as English Communications and Mathematics. Emphasis is placed upon preparing you for the job market, skill programs, apprenticeship programs or further study in Level IV. (For Level IV please see "College Preparatory Program").

FOR MATURE STUDENTS WHO HAVE A SPECIFIC POST SECONDARY GOAL WITHIN HUMBER COLLEGE, A SPECIALLY DESIGNED MINI-PROGRAM CONSISTING OF ONLY THOSE SUBJECTS REQUIRED FOR ENTRY INTO THE POST SECONDARY PROGRAM CAN BE ARRANGED.

College Preparatory Program Level IV

(Level IV — approximately Grades 11-12 equivalent)

These courses duplicate the conditions of study you will encounter when you enter a post secondary program. You will strengthen your skills in such subjects as: English, Mathematics, the Sciences and other subjects. Biology which requires prior completion of Level IV Chemistry is offered at the North Campus only. Life Skills, Typing, Drafting, Economics or Sociology are offered to fulfil the requirements of your program depending on the campus you elect to attend.

Successful completion of the appropriate subjects will give you the basis to apply for admission to a post-secondary program, at any Ontario College of Applied Arts and Technology, where Grade 12 is the normal academic prerequisite. Alternatively, you may wish to use your new skills for direct entry into the job market.

Method of Instruction

- North Campus — standard classroom instruction
Lakeshore Campus — standard classroom instruction or Individualized Learning
Keelesdale Campus — Individualized Learning

Start Dates and Location

North Campus:

- September: Applicants possessing grade 10 or equivalent may begin at the Grade 11 level.
January: Applicants possessing Grade 11 or equivalent may begin at the Grade 12 level.

Lakeshore and Keelesdale Campus:

Full and part-time studies during the day begin *any Monday of the year*.

Part-time evening studies begin the third week in September and the second week in January.

- March to June: An individualized program will be available starting every Monday. Enrollment will be limited to mature students who have applied to post-secondary programs and have received conditional approval subject to upgrading in specific subject areas.

Financial Assistance

CANADA MANPOWER SPONSORSHIP

Basic Training for Skill Development (taught in the College Preparatory Program) is approved by the Canada Employment and Immigration Commission. If you qualify for sponsorship by "Manpower", your tuition and books will be paid for by the Commission. If eligible you may receive a weekly training allowance. For further information and details on sponsorship, contact your nearest Canada Employment Centre.

OTHER SPONSORSHIP

Occasionally, and within their own terms of reference, various agencies such as the Workmen's Compensation Board, the Vocational Rehabilitation Branch, and some employers will consider assisting students. Please contact your local office for details.

ONTARIO STUDENT LOANS PLAN


The Ontario Student Loans Plan is a Government program which provides loans to eligible students. To apply, you must be at least 19 years of age, a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant, and a resident of Ontario for at least 12 months.
