

ABOUT THE BEGINNING AND THE PRESENT

In April 1967, what had been first, the Lakeshore Board of Education Re-training Program and later the Etobicoke Adult Re-training Centre, moved from temporary premises at Mimico High School to a brand new building at 56 Queen Elizabeth Blvd.

From this beginning the Queensway Campus was born in April 1968 and immediate steps were taken to double the size of the building, install the latest equipment and build up a teaching and administra-

tive staff capable of handling the increased responsibilities.

On September 2, 1968 most things were ready and we embarked upon our first full college year as the Queensway Campus. Today, just over six months later, we have a student body of almost 900 and we are constantly adding new day and evening programs to meet the needs of the community we serve.

A FEW WORDS ABOUT THE HEART OF A COLLEGE

Modern, efficient buildings, equipped with the latest equipment plus experienced, dedicated teachers using the latest techniques are important factors in any college. However, it is the students who really count, for they are not only the "HEART" of a college, they are its very reason for existence. At the Queens-

ACADEMIC AND COMMERCIAL PROGRAMS



COLLEGE PREPARATORY

This four level program, which consists of four — 16 week courses, prepares students to enter the 1, 2 and 3 year programs at Humber College. The work covered approximates that of Grades 9-12 of the 4 year high school program.

ACADEMIC UPGRADING

Similar to our College Preparatory Program, but designed for those who wish to up-grade their academic

knowledge and prepare themselves for better positions in industry, business and government.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

A program of 24 week courses is conducted throughout the year for newcomers to Canada who need to achieve a sound working knowledge of English before taking up employment in their professions and trades. Four week courses in Occupational English are also conducted.



COMMERCIAL PROGRAMS

Our Commercial Programs include: Accounting, Clerical, Clerk-Typist, Stenographic and Refresher courses lasting from 16 to 40 weeks. Graduates are prepared for employment in all types of offices.


Our three week Supermarket Checker Education Course is the first in Canada. Graduates are in demand by various Supermarket Chains.



TECHNICAL PROGRAMS

ELECTRONICS

Our Radio and TV Servicing and Instrumentation Programs are right up-to-date. In 40 to 48 weeks we undertake to train highly competent technicians.



CARPET INSTALLATION

Becoming an installation expert in one of Canada's fastest growing industries has changed the economic outlook of many graduates of this program. In 24 weeks you can achieve a high degree of skill.



NURSES' AIDE

Few things are as satisfying and rewarding as helping others. Students in our Nurses' Aide Program rapidly become aware of this. They learn many skills which enable them to perform efficiently in hospitals, nursing homes and other institutions. In 20 weeks we can train you for this interesting profession.

WELDER-FITTER — WELDER-OPERATOR

Competent instructors, first class equipment and the latest techniques characterize our welding programs. In 40 weeks we'll train you to a high standard as a Welder-Fitter. In 20 weeks you'll be able to perform the functions of a Welder-Operator.



MACHINE SHOP

The demand for good machine-shop men remains high and we believe that the graduates of our 40 week courses are among the best. Certainly, we offer the best in instruction and equipment.



DRAFTING

This 40 week course trains you to enter a variety of drafting offices with confidence in your ability to succeed. It's worth investigating.

APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS

The "in college" portion of apprenticeship training in Electrical Construction, Sheet Metal, Steamfitting, Hairdressing, and Funeral Service Education is conducted at the Queensway Campus. Other courses
