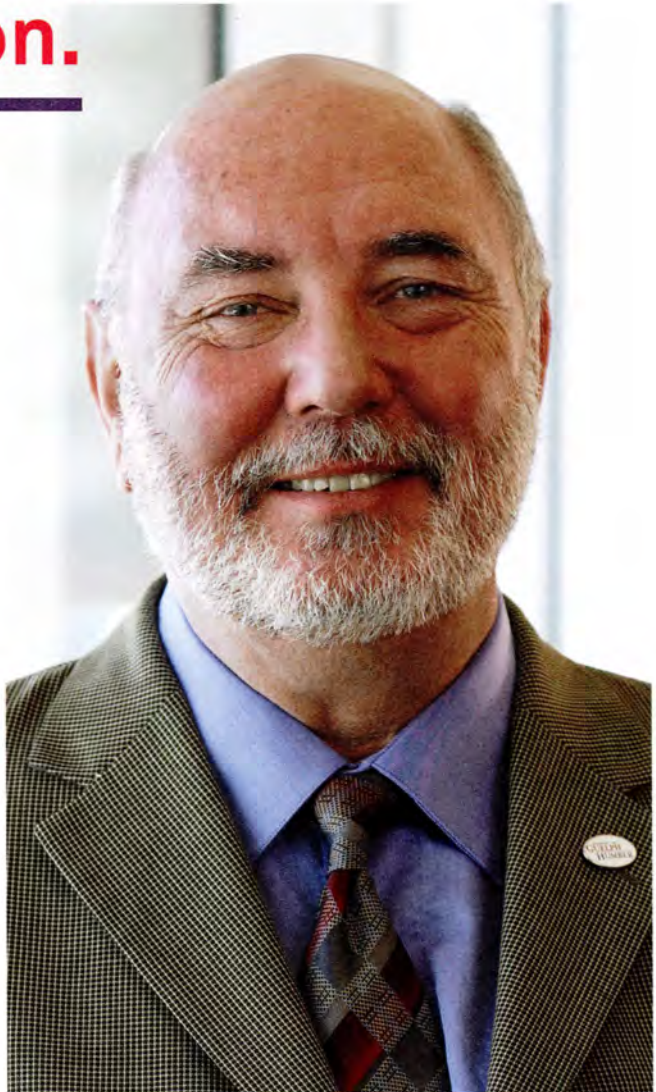

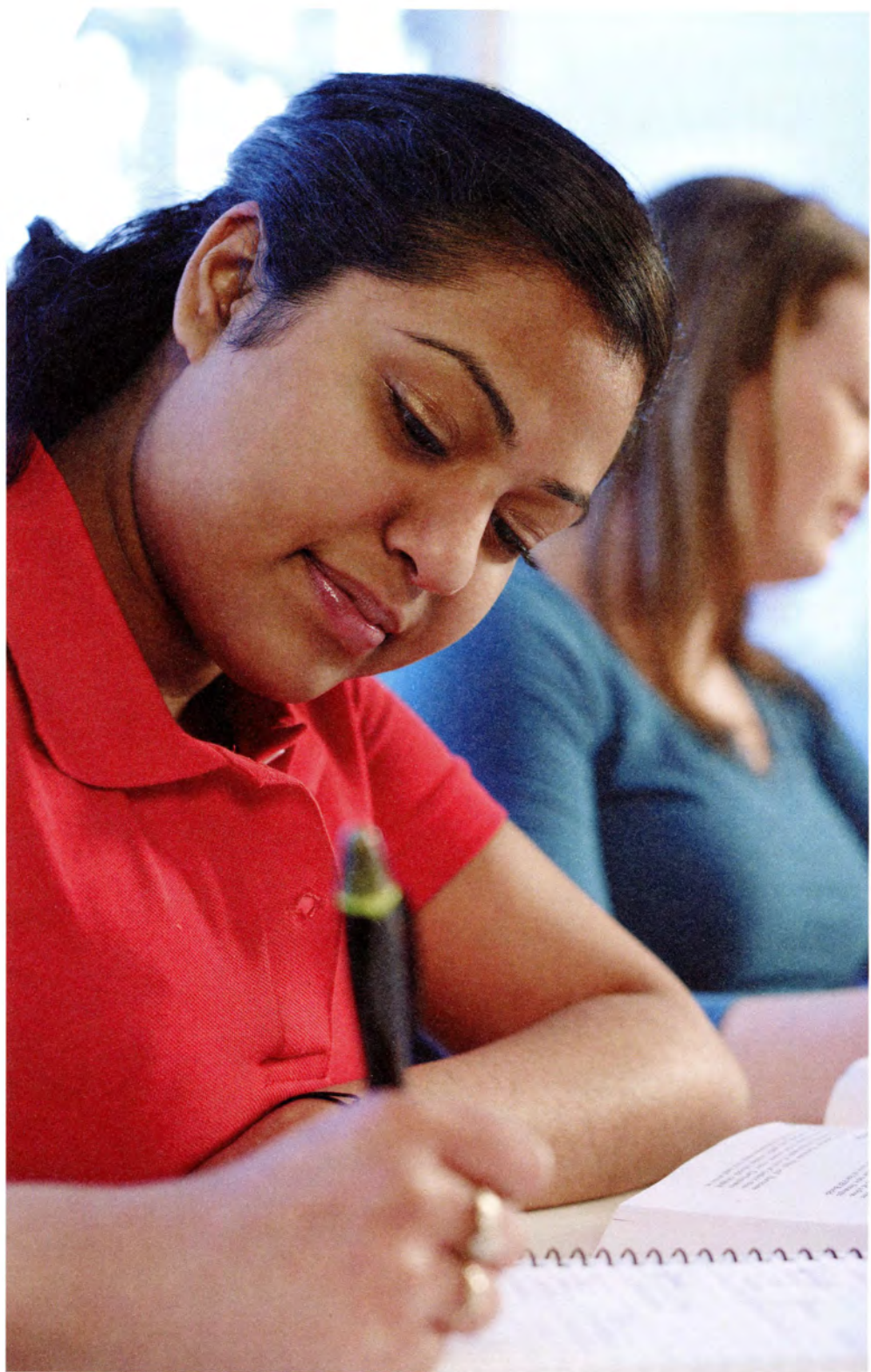

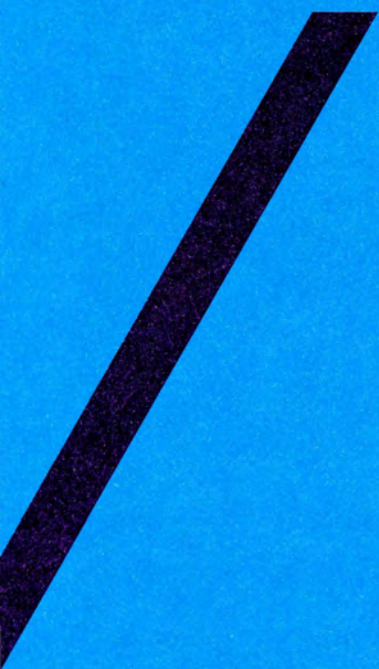

Years 1 and 2: Build a solid foundation

Core courses in the first two years provide the foundation for further studies in business by exploring marketing, logistics, human resource management, finance, and leadership.

Years 3 and 4: Build a personalized portfolio

Focus your studies in one of six areas of emphasis: Accounting, Finance, International Business, Management of Not-for-Profit Enterprises, Marketing, or Small Business Management and Entrepreneurship, or choose to mix and match courses from various areas.

Professional Accreditation

The University of Guelph-Humber offers the course requisites for you to earn the 51 credit hours required for Chartered Accountant candidacy in accordance with the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Ontario (ICAO).

Students who complete specific Finance courses will be eligible to write the Canadian Security Licensing exams.

IN OUR JUSTICE STUDIES PROGRAM, YOU WILL ANALYZE THE JUDGEMENT REQUIRED TO DETERMINE RIGHTS, ASSIGN REWARDS AND PUNISHMENTS.

In second year, you will select a diploma specialization to prepare you for employment or graduate school, areas where an exploration of justice is both relevant and critical.

Police Foundations

Prepare to work in the various levels of Canadian policing through practical courses like Community Policing and Police Governance and Accountability in addition to physical fitness courses.

Law and Security Administration

Train for the wide range of careers in the justice field with courses that cover counselling, law, probation, security, corrections, customs, and immigration.

Build On Your Experience

First Year: Re-enact a criminal case tried in Canada in the Introduction to Law moot court.

Second Year: Investigate a crime scene in Forensic Techniques.

Third Year: Observe societal issues during a streetwalk through downtown Toronto in Canadian Social Problems.

Introductory courses and practical labs allow you to choose an area of emphasis in third year based on your future goals: Digital Communications, Image Arts, Journalism or Public Relations.

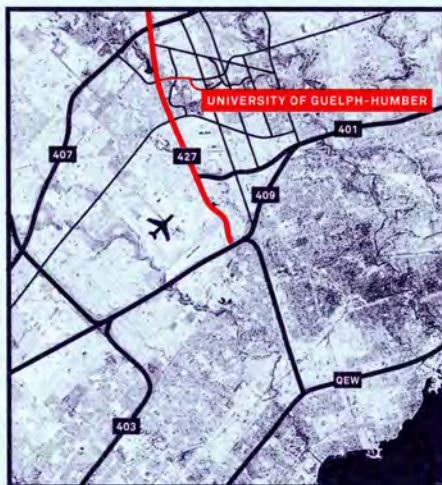

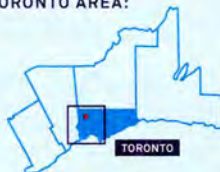

Driving Directions

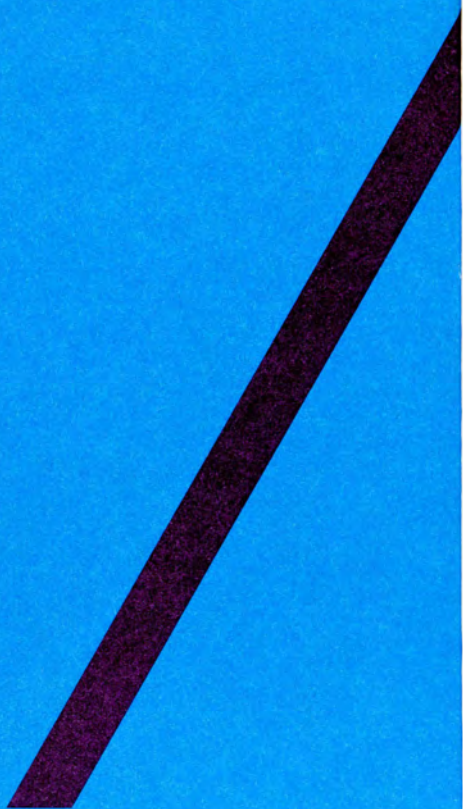

TRANSFER APPLICANT

If you have attended, or if you are currently enrolled in a post-secondary institution (college or university), you are a transfer applicant. You will apply through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre at www.ouac.on.ca using the 105D form by **February 1** or **May 1** based on your intended start date.

Transfer Credit Policy

Refer to the chart below for details on the number of transfer credits you are eligible to receive. Credit will not be granted for college certificates, incomplete diplomas, or if less than two years of a college diploma program has been completed.

If you are not applying from one of the recognized diplomas, or are applying as a university transfer student, credit will be granted based on course work that is similar to the coursework of the University of Guelph-Humber program. Please submit detailed course descriptions to determine transfer credit assessment.

UP TO 5.0 CREDITS*

granted for a completed 2-year recognized diploma with a minimum cumulative average of **75% or above**.

*equivalent to approximately 10 courses or one-year

UP TO 10.0 CREDITS**

granted for a completed 3-year recognized diploma with a minimum cumulative average of **75% or above**.

**equivalent to approximately 20 courses or two-years

Subject Requirements

If you are applying from a recognized diploma program, you will have met the subject requirements through your program of study. If you are not applying from a recognized diploma program you will need to complete the required 4U courses or may have taken the equivalent course through college or university work.

University Transfer

Applicants: A cumulative average of 70% or higher puts you in good standing for admission. Complete a Mature and Transfer Student Profile to be considered for the Student Profile Scholarship at guelphhumber.ca.

I AM attending post-secondary FOR THE first time AND I AM over 21 years of age.

MATURE APPLICANT

If you are 21 years of age or older and have been away from secondary school study for at least two full years and have NOT attended a post-secondary institution, you may apply as a mature applicant. You will apply through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre at www.ouac.on.ca using the 105D form by **May 1, 2011**.

To be considered for admission three 4U or 4M courses including program specific subject requirements must be completed.

Submit your high school transcripts to the university by **June 1, 2011**.

HERE'S A TIP!

Mature Applicants:

A 75% average or higher puts you in good standing for admission and an Academic Merit Entrance Scholarship. If you have an average between 70% – 74.9%, complete a Mature and Transfer Student Profile in order to be considered for admission.

I AM applying from a country OTHER THAN Canada.

INTERNATIONAL APPLICANT

You are considered an international student if you are: enrolled in a high school outside of Canada or if you are NOT a Canadian Citizen, Permanent Resident or Landed Immigrant and you are enrolled in a Canadian high school. Please apply online through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre at www.ouac.on.ca using the 105F form. Application and official documents must be received by **March 1, 2011**.

Country specific admission requirements can be found at guelphhumber.ca/international. Official high school and college/university transcripts are to be sent directly to the University of Guelph-Humber from the originating institution in addition to your proof of English Proficiency. You can also submit a Student Profile which can be found online and can be used to make an admission decision. International transfer applicants are required to submit detailed course outlines to determine transfer credit assessment.

International Requirements

US Requirements

Applicants from US high schools must have a minimum grade point average of 3.0. SAT score of 1100 or ACT score of 24.

International (Non US) Requirements

International applications are individually assessed on country-specific data.

International Baccalaureate (IB)

A minimum score of 24 is required for students applying with an IB diploma. Applicants should complete the diploma with six subjects: three higher level and three standard level. If you are currently enrolled in IB, submit the predicted IB final results. Transfer credit may be given for higher-level courses with grades of five or better.

Advanced Placement (AP)

If you have completed Advanced Placement examinations with a minimum grade of four, you may be eligible to receive university credit to a maximum of two credits, at the discretion of the Admission Committee.

Language Requirements

Applicants whose first language is not English and have completed less than four years of full-time study in an English language school must present proof of English proficiency.
